

Are you anxious? Before the holiday break, do you have a test, assignment, or quiz, and you're feeling anxious but unsure of how to relax? Don't worry! Discover the exact steps for studying for an exam.

1. Ask the right questions

On test day, you don't want to arrive unprepared for what will occur. Try to learn the answers to these important questions before you start studying.

- What will be covered on the test?
- Will there be a review session for the exam during class?
- After school, will there be time for additional review?
- What format does the exam have? Multiple-choice? Fill in the blank. Will students write essays?
- How many points are there on the test?
- Do you have any advice for me on specific studies? (After all, your teacher is the one who knows your work the best!)

2. Create a schedule

You can actually spend less time studying for the test if you have a solid game plan when you first start. List the subjects you'll study and when you'll study them. Determine how much time you'll need to spend studying every day to stay on track and start arranging your study schedule as soon as it's practical (usually a few weeks before your test).

3. Gather your resources

Collect all of your lecture notes, quizzes, handouts, and worksheets. Previous homework will assist you in understanding what your teacher considers significant. (Plus, you may learn from your past quiz mistakes).

4. Learn more efficiently

Instead of trying to memorize every note you took, prioritize what you will study. Start with the test items that are certain to be included. Then move on to those that are likely to be included. Finally, review those that might be included. Even if you run out of time to prepare you will still have covered the essentials. You will have more time to ask your teacher questions or get guidance if you start with the hardest material first.

5. Switch things up

Now that you know WHAT you need to study, decide on the most effective method for reviewing and understanding the material you think will be on the exam. Create flashcards, organize your notes into an outline, and take recordings of you reading your notes.

6. How do you maintain motivation?

You might get better test preparation help from study groups. Make a plan with your classmates to talk and exchange notes, go over the course material, or work through challenging concepts. Instead, give yourself a small reward (even if it's only a TV break) after each study session to keep yourself motivated.

7. Sleep is still important.

An all-nighter may seem appealing, but a good night's sleep is the key to your success. Begin a good sleep schedule in the weeks preceding your exam to ensure that you are rested and ready for the big day.

8. Bring what you are meant to bring.

Notecards, pencils, pens, paper and water or a snack.

Basketball News


December 1, 2022 - Albemarle School played Rock Church and lost 81 to 44.
