DRESS CODE

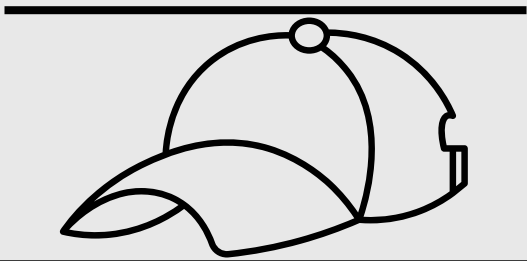
And the reason why

You may be wondering why we even have these rules on the dress code. We have these rules because when these rules are too laid back, people will go too far and wear inappropriate clothing. It helps when we have boundaries. Another reason is to keep people from being distracted like if someone shows up with crazy-colored hair you will be more focused on the hair instead of your work.



- 1.Hats, caps, masks, toboggans, hoods, sweatbands, bandanas, or sunglasses are not allowed to be worn in any classroom or the cafeteria.
- 2.Jewelry should be minimal and non-distracting.
- 3.Doo-rags, stocking caps, combs, picks and brushes are not allowed.
- 4.Pants/shorts must be worn at the waist with no excessive tight fit.
- 5.Students should not wear sagging pants or shorts – no under clothing visible.
- 6.No sleepwear, pajamas, pajama pants, or sweat pants are allowed.
- 7.students should not wear clothes with holes, cutouts, or rips.
- 8.Athletic wear may be worn the day of a game with the coach's approval.
9. Students should not have shirt tails hanging out if the shirt tail is baggy or of extended length..
- 10.Students should not have bare midriffs, low cut tops showing cleavage, backless or net tops, spaghetti straps, halter tops, transparent blouses/shirts, tank tops, short shorts, short miniskirts, or short mini-dresses.
- 11.When standing and arms relaxed at the sides, the length of clothing must be at or below the mid-thigh.
- 12.Slits of dresses must not exceed mid-thigh.
- 13.In addition, when one is seated or bends over, under clothing and/or skin should not be revealed.
- 14.Blinking, studded or chain belts are not permitted.
- 15.Students are not allowed to wear tight clothing such as knit or spandex bicycle/biker pants or overly tight pants, skirts, shorts, or dresses.
- 16.Yoga pants/leggings may be worn with an appropriate top that extends to the mid-thigh.
- 17.Only hair color (dye) that is a natural color (red, blond, brown) is permissible. No student may have more than two tones artificially colored into his/her hair.
- 18.Students are not allowed to have any visible body piercing except for the ears. (No more than two piercings per ear.)
- 19.Visible and permanent tattoos/brands shall be covered to prohibit display.
- 20.Hair should be neatly groomed, clean, and worn so that it is not considered a health hazard or a distraction to instruction and learning. "Mohawk" haircuts or any haircuts with initials and designs are not acceptable.
- 21.Facial hair should meet the criteria of being well-groomed.
- 22.Application of make-up during class is not allowed. Excessive or distracting makeup is not allowed.
- 23.Students will display higher expectations of dress code while attending field trips and athletic events representing Albemarle School. (Teacher or Coach Requirement)
- 24.The school Headmaster/designated may approve certain items as spirit wears for particular school days or events.

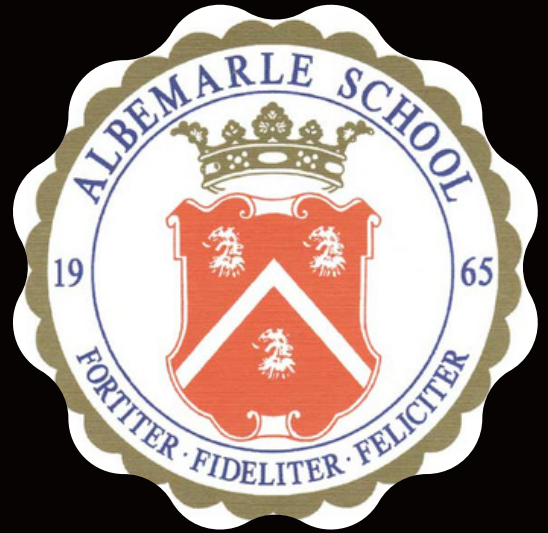
Next month there will be a tournament for basketball. The teams of the colts will be JV, Varsity, and Middle school boys and girls.

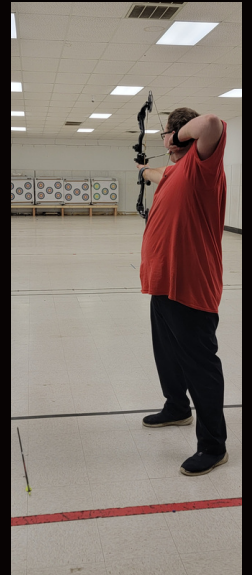


Hunter Safety
